

**Safety Notes and Operating Instructions
Floor Sander - Models 848 and 849.**

N.B. Where possible a residual current circuit breaker (R.C.C.B.) should be used with this machine.

SAFETY NOTES.

- A. Do not use the machine in damp conditions and do not expose it to rain.
- B. Always wear goggles and a face mask.
- C. Empty the dust collecting bag regularly, as the concoction of wood dust, paints, oils and varnishes is prone to combustion.
- D. Wood dust is easily ignited :-
Do not smoke when using the machine.
Ensure all nails are removed or punched below the surface to avoid sparks.
Do not empty the dust on to an open fire.
- E. If the machine fails to operate do not attempt to repair it. It should be returned to the distributor.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS.

- A. Tilt the machine backwards and switch on.
- B. Lower the machine gently on to the floor and always keep it moving to prevent gouges.
- C. Close doors and open all windows to minimise the spread of dust.
- D. Never use the machine without sandpaper fitted.
- E. An edging sander, model E55, can be used to obtain very good results close to a skirting board.
